I thought I would also include a couple of photos of Carrie's coin that she brought to our last meeting. She'd found what she thought was an old 2p coin on the shoreline before noticing it bore unusual markings. Her daughter Charlotte, an archaeologist, contacted the British Museum with it to be told it was likely to have been made in Tournes, on the NW border between France and Belgium, sometime between 1415 and 1521!! It was not a Coin of the Realm as each town in those days produced its own local currency and this coin had journeyed from Tournes, perhaps with a fisherman or other trader. Carrie said the Museum had other (better) examples, so she was allowed to keep it - to our benefit. What a find!
